Making sense of children and young people's mental health outcomes in naturalistic settings

Abstract

Randomized controlled trials are the gold standard for evaluating whether mental health interventions work, however they have their limitations in terms of evaluating the effectiveness of interventions in real practice.

This talk will introduce CORC, a consortium of child and adolescent mental health services who collect outcomes data in naturalistic settings. Challenges provided by naturalistic collection will be explained, including non-random dropout, regression to the mean, and spontaneous recovery, together with recent results using methods designed to overcome these challenges.
